GAUCHOS UNANIMOUS; BOWLS BEGIN SAT.

SAN MATEO (Nov. 12 2006) – Undefeated and top-ranked **Saddleback** (10-0) leads ten teams into the California Community College football playoffs, starting Saturday.

Saddleback is a unanimous No.1 choice in the final regular season poll of the **California CC Football Coaches Association**, as compiled by the **JC Athletic Bureau**, topping all 20 ballots.

No. 2 Foothill and **No. 3 Santa Rosa JC** did not qualify for the state playoffs, losing a tiebreaker in the NorCal Conference to No. 4 City College of San Francisco. All three finished with 9-1 season records.

CCSF will host **No. 8 Fresno** on Dec. 2 at 1 p.m. in the San Francisco Hawaiian Punch Community College Bowl for Northern California's berth in the **COA/state championship** game at Fresno's **Chukchansi Park** (Grizzlies Stadium) on Dec. 9 at 1 p.m. CCSF won an early non-conference game at Fresno CC, 34-31. Fresno was also the highest ranked non-conference team to play – and lose to – one of the NorCal Conference tri-champs and gave CCSF the conference tiebreaker.

Saddleback opens the eight-team **Southern California** playoffs Saturday, hosting **No. 22 Palomar** (6-4) in the **National Bowl** at 5 p.m. Defending state champion **No. 7 Grossmont** (9-1) opens by hosting **No. 11 Victor Valley** (9-1) in the 1 p.m. **Southern California** Bowl. Grossmont defeated CCSF, 41-38, in the 2005 state title game and finished 13-1.

Saturday's remaining playoffs pit **No. 9 Moorpark** (9-1) at **No. 6 El Camino** (8-2) in the **American Bowl** at 6 p.m. and **No. 25 Citrus** (7-3) at **No. 5 Bakersfield** (9-1) in the **Golden Empire Bowl** at 3 p.m. Higher seeds host semifinal games Nov. 25. Southern Calif. title game is Dec. 2.
